Bulamahlo Home & Day Care Centre (BHDCC) was opened in 1989 by Mrs Regina Sekgobela in Lifateng,

Tembisa. It was first opened as a creche and day-care centre to provide education and child care services to

the community of Tembisa. Then there started becoming a massive crisis in Tembisa with many abandoned children and abused children and Ma Regina responded to the call to become a foster mother and take care of children in this situation. The home grew because of her reputation for the wonderful care and compassion she showed to these abused and orphaned children. Soon the demand for children being brought in by the Police and Social Workers meant that they had to apply to become a Non-Profit Organisation to raise more funds.

In 2008 Bulamahlo was registered as an NPO. Now they have 20 children attending the creche for daycare and 20 children requiring full-time care. These children requiring full-time care are from ages 2-16 and are a mixture of orphans, foster children, missing children, and abused children placed in Mrs Sekgobela's care while awaiting trial.

Township Fleva

Township Fleva was founded by Masego Lebotse and Rashuping Morake, who through their efforts with the NGO Rhiza Babuyile aim to develop township communities and consequently came with the business idea for Township Fleva. Township Fleva aims to provide customers with quality products and services from the townships and at the same time create jobs and support entrepreneurs from those very same townships. Township Fleva focuses on services relating to B-BBEE, being Skills Development, Enterprise Development, Supplier Development, and Procurement. From a product perspective, Township Fleva focuses on the clothing industry, where it provides aspiring designers with the opportunity to create clothes that will be sold both locally and internationally. The profits of Township Fleva are donated to the South African NGO Rhiza Babuyile. This organization assists underprivileged communities with a holistic development model that includes programs in education, skills development, education, and enterprise development.

Village Kids

Started with underprivileged children in Garden Village which Remo Lenisa took to heart together with his wife Jo and opened a daycare facility for the children in the community. Our canteen makes lunch for the children daily and we support the daycare with annual activities such as Mandela Day and Santa Shoebox projects.

House of Grace

Aunty Naeema as we call her is from Macassar, she is the biological mother of two boys. Since turning her home into **House of Grace** she is affectionately known as 'mamma' to several children that she fosters through child welfare and privately. Aunty Naeema previously worked as a volunteer

at her local Child Welfare and through their various training programs she is now a qualified social auxiliary worker.

Aunty Naeema was approached by locals who could not support their children due to their drug addiction, alcoholism to take the children into her capacity to raise. She saw a greater need in the community and later decided to create a warm and loving home for children whose parents are unable to care for them at her NPO House Of Grace.

Caring for these children has become a family affair; her husband and children have taken it upon themselves to support her as using volunteers became a complicated matter. Some of the children in her care have disabilities and potentially life-threatening conditions and behavioural problems at school. And yet she tackles each of these obstacles with positivity and determination.

Aunty Naeema does not have a lot of resources at her disposal and although she is not keen on asking for help, she reaches out to her network of contacts and friends if one her wards are in need. Compuscan/Experian has recently become a family aunty Naeema can reach out to for special occasions such as Christmas.

House Of Grace has an open-door policy. If anyone in the neighbourhood needs a sandwich, a plate of food, or a shoulder to lean on, she is their go-to person. House of Grace is currently a home to 14 children from ages 2-12.
